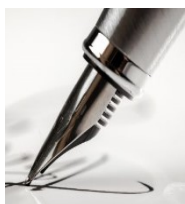
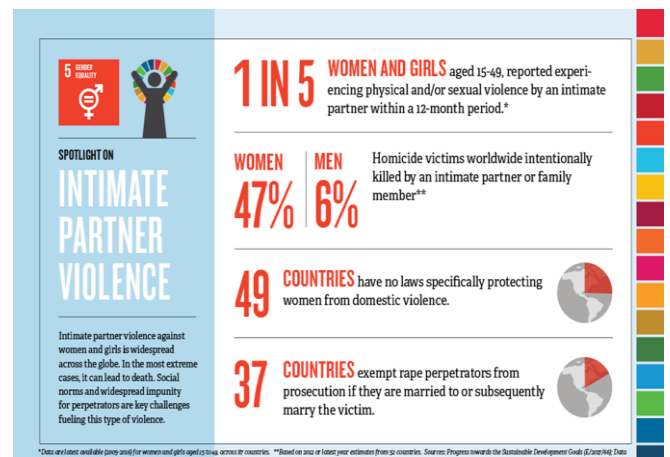

Spotlight Initiative
To eliminate violence against women and girls

The Spotlight Initiative: Eliminating violence and harmful practices against women and girls is an unprecedented, partnership between the EU and the UN.

It is comprehensive in scope, targeted in focus, & is changing how business is conducted across the UN system and across countries and regions.

Solutions rely on working at multiple levels and bringing many different players to the table, on holding the uncomfortable conversations that address the root causes of such violence and in extending rights and opportunities to those who have previously been excluded.

The name of the Initiative – Spotlight – symbolizes the importance of driving this issue into the light so it can be seen, tackled and eliminated. The UN and participating countries are willing to spread that light. Now is the time for everyone to join this EU/UN initiative eg.

In Malawi, *Spotlight* are supporting dialogue on discriminatory social norms to teach communities how to build non-violent, respectful and equitable relationships from early childhood onwards.

In Mexico, they are training health care workers to identify early signs of abuse and prevent violence against women through school-based campaigns

In Niger, they are engaging men and boys and strengthening the ability of women's rights defenders to advocate policy reform and hold decision-makers accountable.

In Zimbabwe, they are using radio and other media to spread awareness. To ensure that services are accessible to all women and girls, they are introducing measures such as access ramps at service centres, sign language, braille and audio versions of information materials.
